After considering the material available on record, the applicant trust/ society/ non profit company is hereby granted registration with salient activities as **Advancement of any other object of general public utility** and the provisions of sections 11 and 12 shall apply in the case from the **Assessment Year: 2020-21**.

1	As and when there is a move to amend or alter the objects/rules and regulations of the applicant, prior approval of the Commissioner shall be sought along with the draft of the amended deed and no such amendment shall be effected until and unless the approval is accorded.
2	In the event of dissolution, surplus and assets shall be given to an organization, which has similar objects and no part of the same will go directly or indirectly to anybody specified in section 13(3) of the Income Tax Act, 1961.
3	In case the trust/institution is converted into any form, merged into any other entity or dissolved in any previous year in terms of provisions of section 115TD, the applicant shall be liable to pay tax and interest in respect of accreted income within specified time as per provisions of section 115TD to 115TF of the Income Tax Act, 1961 unless the application for fresh registration under section 12AA for the said previous year is approved by the Commissioner.

5	The registration u/s 12AA of the Income Tax Act, 1961 does not automatically confer any right on the donors to claim deduction u/s 80G.
6	Order u/s 12AA(1)(b) read with section 12A does not confer any right of exemption upon the applicant u/s 11 and 12 of Income Tax Act, 1961. Such exemption from taxation will be available only after the Assessing Officer is satisfied about the genuineness of the activities promised or claimed to be carried on in each Financial Year relevant to the Assessment Year and all the provisions of law acted upon. This will be further subject to provisions of section 2(15) of the Income Tax Act, 1961.
7	No change in terms of Trust Deed/ Memorandum of Association shall be effected without due procedure of law and its intimation shall be given immediately to this office. The registering authority reserves the right to consider whether any such alteration in objects would be consistent with the definition of "charitable purpose" under the Act and in conformity with the requirement of continuity of registration.
8	The Trust/ Society/ Non Profit Company shall maintain accounts regularly and shall get these accounts audited in accordance with the provisions of the section 12A(1)(b) of the Income Tax Act, 1961. Seperate accounts in respect of each activity as specified in Trust Deed/ Memorandum of Association shall be maintained. A copy of such account shall be submitted to the Assessing Officer. A public notice of the activities carried on/ to be carried on and the target group(s) (intented beneficiaries) shall be duly displyed at the Registered/ Designated Office of the Organisation.
9	The Trust/ Institution shall furnish a return of income every year within the time limit prescribed under the Income Tax Act, 1961.
10	Seperate accounts in respect of profits and gains of business incidental to attainment of objects shall be maintained in compliance to section 11(4A) of Income Tax Act, 1961.
11	The registered office or the principal place of activity of the applicant should not be transferred outside the jurisdiction of undersigned except with the prior approval.
12	No asset shall be transferred without the knowledge of undersigned to anyone, including to any Trust/ Society/ Non Profit Company etc.



However, the broad objectives of **JEEVAN DHARA CULTURAL SOCIETY – INDORE** based on which it established are divided in to Two parts – One are Long Term Objects – Considering the Long Term Planning and other are Short Term Objects – Considering the Short Term Planning which are meant of the meeting out Short Term Goals and objects and other are meant for the long term planning of the Society for the Charitable Objects as well as Overall Social Upliftment to be meet out in the long run for the over all Social Welfare in all dimensions of the Human Life are detailed below:

A. EDUCATION:

- 1. To promoting, motivating and mobilize the community on formal education at all levels i.e. primary secondary and higher education.
- 2. To work for achieving 100% enrolment of children in the age group of 5-14 year so that they are able to join the mainstream of education.
- 3. To establish and/or support non-formal education centers in remote villages(both residential and non-residential) for the children of 5-14 years to prepare them for formal schooling.
- 4. To promote education of Fmaily life, National Integration and Communal/Social Harmony amongst adolescents, eligible teenagers and neo-literates.
- 5. To develop awareness about education as well as various schemes and incentives introduced by the Government to promote education, particularly for girls.
- 6. To promoting sports, games, institute awards, prizes, prophies etc. as part of innovative means of education, with a view to develop healthy competitiveness amongst students and institutions.

- 7. To promote and provide educational services, particularly for slum dwellers, school, drop-out and enrolled children, belonging to scheduled caste and scheduled tribe, disabled and slow-witted children with a view to rehabilitable and prepare them for leading a respectable independent life.
- 8. To promoting moral and ethical values through social and educational institutions for includating self-discipline and developing an ideal National character.

B. LIVELIHOOD

- 1. To Imparting vocational trainings on income generation activites to various section of society, particularly those belonging to families living below the poverty line.

CHALLENGES AHEAD

Looking into back five years of our activities in spheres of our performances and achievements. We have faces the following challenges, particularly in rural and tribal belts of intervening areas, which have proved to be obstacles for achieving optimum results in terms of goals set forth:

- 1. **Social Backwardness:** Like blind faith on age-old tradition, magical beliefs etc. prevents the peoples for adopting innovative means.
- 2. **Illiteracy:** It is the biggest problem facing the country today and the main cause of economic and social problems.
- 3. **Untouchability:** Despite the best al-round efforts, both legally and socially to eliminate this social menace persisting in some remote rural parts of India and thus hampering the co-operative activities and efforts.
- 4. **Ignorance:** Because of lack of proper awareness, people are still ignorant about their rights and responsibilities, as enshrined in various enactments and because of such ignorance; they surrender themselves against exploitation has perpetuated upon them by the stakes.
- 5. **Women's explotation**: Still in many parts of India, the women folks suffer all types of exploitation due to their illiteracy, poverty, and social backwardness.
- 6. **Delay in releasing project funds:** Because of bureaucratic hassles, there is at a times, inordinate delays in release of project funds, causing vital delays in the project itself, of course, every effort is being made at various levels to face and overcome the aforesaid challenges, which includes;
 - Social awareness campaign;
 - Improving educational level;
 - Reducing economic dependence;
 - Making people self-reliant;
 - Generating additional sources of livelihood;

- Employment of women;
- Uplifting the downtrodden and deprived sections of society;
- Promoting people's participation in developmental activities;
- Promoting leadership qualities amongst women;
- Role of women in decision making process at all levels;

However, it requires a concerted effort by all concerned, including the funding agencies, to ensure proper and effective implementation of the projects for achieving the desired goals. We are quite hopeful of succeeding in our efforts, which have already started showing positive results.

PERSPECTIVE PLANNING

Millennium Development Goals:

Being a Fast Growing / State level voluntary organization, the **JEEVAN DHARA CULTURAL SOCIETY – INDORE** in its perspective planning policies, has adopted the various Millennium Development Goals as set forth by the Govt of India under their various plans and Policies at a convention represented by various countries under unified development Program . The development policies of several government across the developing world have mirrored a legitimate commitment to the framework as per the object of the Society and has been no exception. Accordingly, the Planning Commission of India has evolved the National Development Goals as part of its Five Year Plans targets. This essentially based on the following 10 MDG targets.

- 1. Eradication of poverty;
- 2. Upliftment of Poor / Slum Community
- 3. Achievement of Universal primary education;
- 4. Promotion of gender equality;
- 5. Reduction of child mortality;

- 6. Improvement of maternal health;
- 7. Combating HIV / AIDS, Malaria and other diseases;
- 8. Ensuring environmental sustainability; and
- 9. Developing a global partnership for development.
- 10. Sarv Shiksha Abhiyan

Therefore, keeping in view the inherent importance of aforesaid Goals the Managing Committee of **JEEVAN DHARA CULTURAL SOCIETY – INDORE** has decided to work towards achieving the aforesaid goals in the following manner.

REDUCING BELOW POVERTY LINE:-

As per available statistical data, about 43% of population in India, including rural Slum dwellers, tribal areas, scheduled castes and scheduled tribes, live below the poverty line. Therefore, no Country even dreams of progress and prosperity, till this level is drastically reduced, if not completely eliminated. Therefore, it is of dire importance to make all out efforts to increase the sources of livelihood so that people living in BPL has brought above this line so that they can contribute their bit in the overall development of the country. This is also one of the main objectives under the 11th Five year Plan of the country, as part of Millennium Development Goals. Looking at the importance of this objective in its perspective planning policies, aspires to give appropriate thrust towards achieving this goal of National importance.

With this objective in mind, JEEVAN DHARA CULTURAL SOCIETY - INDORE is giving top priority in its perspective planning policies to make a concentrated effort towards increasing the sources of Livelihood , Skill Development Program , Promotion of Employment through Vocational Training and to prepare the people capable enough for earning which is sufficient for them to lead an improved quality of life in the society with optimum level of standard of living due to increase of the overall monthly income of the poor and slum community..

HEALTH AND SANITATION:

It has been realized that with the growing population, people require an increased and improved services specially that of health to cater to their requirement. The situation calls for immediate attention in the growing cities where most of the population is either illiterate or poverty stricken, living in difficult conditions and largely ignorant to avail health services. The available health services, particularly in cities, are either very expensive or depend on the whims of the Government functionaries. The problems in Government, run hospital are numerable, ranging from non-availability of drugs/facilities to the indifferent attitude of Doctors and paramedics. The condition in private hospitals is also not very satisfactory due to their financial motive. All the growing cities, without exception, are. Therefore, in dire need of proper health care services. The poor health condition has attributed:

- a) Insensitivity of the masses to wards preventive health care services;
- b) Unhygienic conditions;
- c) Lacking of facilities etc.

To offset such deficiencies, a beginning has to make by ensuring appropriate meternal and child health care, which include proper immunization to mother and children, regular growth monitoring and the like.

GENDER EQUALITY WOMEN EMPOWERNMENT:

It has estimated that 78% of India's working women involved in agriculture 35% of which as cultivators and 43% as laborers. The women in urban slums and villages are relatively worst off than men has additionally burdened with responsibilities of their homes. With no real economic independence, non-existent involvement in the decision making process and most importantly their low level of awareness even on common developmental issues, their basic rights, ways and means to have access up to the available facilities. Consequently, this section of the society has become the victim of social and economic inequalities perpetuated by an exploitative social, economic and political order. Wage discrimination and

exclusion from decision-making process has made an adverse impact on their control over resources, access to livelihood opportunities, information, technology, skills and so on.

There fore the intervention of **JEEVAN DHARA CULTURAL SOCIETY – INDORE** is required pointiest. Both in urban and rural areas and all possible steps are being taken to address the needs of women in deprived areas to ensure that the resources and means are available to them so that they can participate in the decision making process of developmental activates and also to involve them in the sustainable manner.

To continue the efforts of empowering women **JEEVAN DHARA CULTURAL SOCIETY – INDORE** envisages for strengthening partnership with the tribal and davit women in its developmental areas. In order to enhance the status of women and promote gender equality, women are to be encouraged and empowered to participate with their full potential and on equal footing. To ensure their economic independence, attempts has made towards bridging the gap between community forums and the government and for establishing a viable linkage with the line departments to help in reducing poverty. Our interventions also aims to prepare them to act as agents for change not only in the community development initiatives but to work as a pressure group to pursue policies related to community development at all possible levels. Our plans continue towards empowering and enabling the women, in our target areas, to participate in policy-making and decision-making process at all levels of the society.

IMPARTING PRIMARY EDUCATION:

'Education' has considered to only investment, which always spreads and enhances the social capital of the society. The aim to **JEEVAN DHARA CULTURAL SOCIETY** – **INDORE** continues to raise awareness amongst parents, youths, and the adults on the need for education not only for their children but also for themselves for improving the overall educational status of the society. The strategy has formulated towards awareness campaigns for raising awareness amongst parents and children for joining formal education systems with a view to minimize illiteracy in the identifies villages and slums. As the saying goes, "Educate a man and you help one individual, while educating a women, you help a

family". Therefore the adult education, particularly for women, has envisaged as one of the features of awareness campaigns so that good social dividends could reaped.

OTHER AREAS OF INTERVENTIONS:

- 1. **Helping the Handicapped / Disables:** Various schemes are to be promoted to make the handicapped economically self-dependent, particularly out of the Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribe population, So that they may lead a respectable, economically independent life with due social acceptance.
- 2. Tree and Herbal Plantations: With a view to intervene inenvironmental issues and promote Ayurvedic treatment, schemes has devised and promoted medicinal the rural populace of India, for tree as well as herbal plantations with medicinal value. This will not only generate new sources of livelihood for them, but will also meet the growing requirement of such plants in India.
- 3. **Social Marketing:** Every effort will be made, by way of arranging awareness campaigns, meetings, personal counseling, Tele counseling and distribution of contraceptives, to control the dreaded disease of HIV/AIDS which has now taken a magnitude of global concern.
- 4. **Soil Conservation:** The farmers are to be encouraged for tree plantation so that soil erosion may be contained and fertility of the land in improved. This will help them not only to get maximum crops but will also improve their earnings and financial status. In addition, in co-ordination with village people, tanks and canals has also constructed so that farmers dependence on rainwater has reduced.
- 5. Adopting Villages: In an innovative effort, the JEEVAN DHARA CULTURAL SOCIETY INDORE planed to adopt certain number of villagers. Every year with the object to register the expectant mothers, as well as children of such villages, provide them with proper vaccination, affordable but nutritious food and conduct their regular check-up, so that their health has be maintained at the desired level.
- 6. **Drop-out children:** Attempt is to be making for ensuring at least the primary education to the dropout children of urban slum areas, in the target districts, to select each year.

- 7. Elimination of child labour practice: Although engagement of children in activities with in the definition of "Child Labout" has benn legally prohibited, but still the number of children engaged in one or another type of such activities is still prevalent in almost all parts of India. This not only hampers their proper education, but also restricts their future growth. Therefore, JEEVAN DHARA CULTURAL SOCIETY INDORE has vowed to work towards elimination of this menace of "Child Labout" at least in the areas of its intervention.
- 8. **Development of non-forest waste land:-** Taking clue from the policy initiative of Government of Madhya Pradesh for development of non-forest waste land in all the districts of Madhya Pradesh, through the public private partnership. including Non-voluntary organization, out proposals are already under consideration with the district authorities and we hope of commence our activities in this behalf very soon.
- 9. Environment Awareness Program Society has organized various Environment Awareness Campaign in villages along with various Water Shed Management Program for the Conservation of Water in Villages with the support of villagers and Society Body Members and Team of Dedicated Volunteers and undertake various Projects and Programs by way of making Stop Dam, Maid Bandhan, Bori Bandhan, Check Dam, Pits and used various Scientific Methods for the water management program in villages and also aware the villagers about climate change and in the Camp 100 peoples participated in the camp and 150 plants were planted at Various Gram of Madhya Pradesh and also participated in various Social Welfare and Upliftment related activities for Women and Child Welfare, Women Literacy and Women Empowerment and various Social Welfare and upliftment related activities through out the year.
